Use, or want to use, web or cell phone in ministry? Need to consider the influence of new technology for church and faith?

Join **Dr Heidi Campbell**, Assistant Professor, Department of Communication, Texas A&M University, USA, author of *Exploring Religious Community Online: We are one in the network*, that looks at how members of online religious communities connect their online and offline social-religious networks.

While many critics of doing church and religion on line have been highly suspect of the disembodied nature of online communication and community, Heidi's research argues that online religious networks often offer a more realistic picture of how people actually live in contemporary western society.

Drawing from ten years of research on how online Christian communities live out their religious lives online, demonstrates that people frequently conceive of, and define, Christian community in terms of social networks (over many common theological models such as Paul's image of the 'body of Christ'). Through exploring 6 general traits of online Christian community we are able to consider implications and possibilities of this emerging definition of community for discussions of Church and religion in a networked culture.
