# mission shaped ministry training



# Explanation of Terms What is a fresh expression? a form of church for our changing culture, established primarily for the benefit of people who are not yet members, that comes into being through listening, service, relationships and making disciples. What is pioneering? people, of many shapes and sizes, with a passion and purpose to start new things in God's Kingdom. What is mixed economy? a way in which fresh expressions and more inherited expressions of church support one another, are equal partners in mission and respect each other's distinctiveness. WHAT HAS HAPPENED SO FAR? In November 2010, about 14 people from a number of denominations (Anglican, Baptist, Lutheran, Uniting) and states (NSW, Victoria,

What if I wasn't part of these initial groups? The purpose of November 18, 19 is to help folk come on board, particularly those who want to be part of establishing msm in their city and state. The Australian-UK Memorandum of Understanding is designed so that at any stage, parties can participate. This involves agreeing to the terms and providing a \$1000 joining fee.

number of denominations (Anglican, Baptist, Lutheran, Uniting) and states (NSW, Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia) met to explore ways to offer a contextualised version of the mission-shaped ministry in Australia. This has resulted first, in a Australian-UK Memorandum of Understanding, second the cultivation of a national training team and third, the offering of two pilot courses (one in Adelaide over 14 mid-week evenings and another in Canberra pilot over 3 weekends).

47 folk enrolled in Adelaide, 13 in Canberra. Their feedback has been overwhelmingly positive.

## KEY STEPS TO TEACH mission shaped ministry:

- Attend the seminar.
- Establish ecumenical training partnerships in your area.
- Become a signatory in the msm Australian-UK Memorandum of Understanding.

# WHAT IS mission shaped ministry COURSE?

The mission shaped ministry course developed in the UK. It explores a church that connects, and a spirituality that engages contemporary life today. Developed by the Anglican, Methodist and United Reformed Church, it is currently running in over 30 centres across the United Kingdom.

Core values include hospitality, prayer, ecumenical generosity, interactive learning and practitioner teachers.

Along with input, the course offers ongoing coaching and learning networks for those wanting to continue the mission journey and ground the learnings in their local context.

The mission shaped ministry course is aimed at lay and clergy, leaders and congregants, dreamers and doers, stakeholders and permission-givers. It is focused on both those interested in fresh expressions of church and wanting their existing church to be more mission-shaped.

The entire course includes teaching on areas like mission of God; vision and call; missional values; spirituality for mission; learning from weakness; faith-sharing; engaging with your community; starting and growing a fresh expression; what is church?; discipleship; gospel and culture; leadership matters; worship and sacraments in fresh expressions.
