Who is the missiology stream?

What is missiology?

Missiology is the study of the nature, purposes and acts of God the Trinity and their implications for the being, character and calling of the Church in the world. Missiology includes the study of theological method, social and cultural analysis, systematic theology, church history, apologetics, public theology, theology of mission and evangelism.

On the move

In July Dr Rosemary Dewerse stepped into the Director's role as Steve Taylor stepped into the College Principal role as Andrew Dutney became President of the Uniting Church for the next three years! For 2013 we have a growing line-up of adjunct and visiting lecturers from several cultures and a range of backgrounds and life experiences preparing to contribute to our courses.

Spirit-ed Missiology for a Global Church

This year's overseas expertise came from Dr Kirsteen Kim from Leeds University, UK, in July, a specialist in mission and pneumatology. Students gathered for a week's intensive and have done thoughtful assignment work in response.

Covenanting

We continue our commitment to covenanting with our local Aboriginal nations, including involvement with the Covenanting Committee. In July this year a panel of Aboriginal leaders contributed to two morning sessions of Spirit-ed Missiology, a mutually significant experience for all. Rosemary is about to convene with Denise Champion a group preparing resources for cultural sensitivity training. There are plans to involve Aboriginal leaders in classes during 2013, and in February candidates will have the opportunity to be part of a three-day cultural immersion, which we hope will become an annual event.

Journal of Ministry Practice

A dream of Steve's, the journal is now in the drafting stages. John Swinton, who spoke so helpfully at the February 2012 Presbytery and Synod gathering, is keen to be engaged in the project with his students. The first issue will draw on reflections made by our students – a number of whom are involved in the Master of Ministry (missional) – and is designed to be an accessible resource for the wider church. Out and about - Steve

Technically, Steve was supposed to be on sabbatical in the first semester, but he got himself a new role...Sabbatical will happen over summer and into March. He has, however, had an article in Australian Leadership, completed two book projects - chapters on indigienous communion practices, and sustainability in fresh expressions – taught on another Mission Shaped Ministry course, spoken at the Uniting World Retreat, Summer Spirit and CampFIRE in Perth, Catholic Education, Grace Network, the Magerey Lectures for Churches of Christ (SA), and Refresh weekends in Eyre Peninsula, Robe and Laura.

Rosemary has an article in *Australian Leadership* coming up, is at the printing stage of an illustrated book on seven early Maori Christians, is writing a paper on Atuatanga (Maori knowing of God), and will be readying her PhD for publication over summer.
